1 Background

I farm sheep and beef cattle on our family farm in Llangammarch Wells. We live in a rather high rainfall area of Wales, and therefore cattle must be wintered indoors, which is expensive. I currently rear and finish 150 Angus cattle per year. My main reason for going to Ireland was to find a more cost-effective method of winter housing cattle other than straw.

2 Itinerary

During my visit to Ireland, I was very fortunate to visit a lot of very good cattle sheds and meet some very interesting farmers. I visited eight different slatted floor cattle sheds, and every shed was slightly different, and had good and bad points. But one thing became very clear: this was what I needed on my own farm.




Woolsey Concrete

On my first day in Ireland, I visited Woolsey Concrete, where I was able to have a tour of their factory and see how they make the concrete slats, before visiting three farms to see their products in use.









Easyfix

I liked the idea of having rubber matting on top of the slats for animal comfort. I then visited Easyfix where the rubber matting is designed and made. They showed me around their factory before taking me to see the mats on-farm.







Keenan



I had a very detailed tour of the factory, where I learnt about the different stages involved in designing and making their feeders, along with the history of the company.






Gerard Dineen

They had an excellent cattle setup with some of the best sheds I had seen on my visit to Ireland, along with a high-tech air operated handling system.









Next Steps

Since returning from Ireland, I have put all of this into practice and converted my own straw-bedded cattle shed into a slatted floor shed, which I can use to house my cattle through the winter and fatten cattle in the summer with no bedding cost. This has made a massive difference to the profit of my cattle business, as I would not have been able to continue farming beef cattle on this farm using straw bedding. I have also bought a Keenan feeder!
